THINGS TOO UGLY

Things Too Ugly is an interactive narrative puzzle experience set against the Mississippi River watershed in 1986. The viewer embodies a Risk Assessment & Management Data Processor at TEREBRO INC., a fictional natural resource company. The role of the Data Processor is to sift through past incident files and glean clues for input into the proprietary VERI-FI software; doing so models alternative approaches that may yield more favorable outcomes during future incidents. What begins as an uneventful overnight shift, soon turns urgent as The Supervisor, present only through an intercom, leads the viewer through a dark story of unethical practices, environmental abuse, and inhumanity. TEREBRO's most mysterious and devious incident now lays bare on the Data Processor's desk.
